We gather at a decisive moment. As you open this program, Ukraine continues its heroic resistance against Russia's aggression in the fifth year of the full-scale invasion and the thirteenth year of the war that began in 2014. For more than a decade, Ukraine has stood on the frontline of a struggle that reaches far beyond its borders - a struggle for sovereignty, freedom, and the rules-based international order.

Our central question remains: Is there light ahead? Is the world capable of stopping this war and securing a just peace for Ukraine, or are we entering a darker era of expanding conflicts and renewed imperial ambitions? Ukraine seeks peace and works tirelessly toward this goal. Yet peace cannot be built on illusions. It requires strength, common defence, and unwavering solidarity among free nations.

The Kyiv Security Forum brings together international leaders, Nobel Peace Prize laureates, senior military commanders, diplomats, innovators, and public intellectuals to reflect on these challenges and explore the choices facing the world.

This year also marks the 40th anniversary of the Chernobyl catastrophe. Today, Russia's attacks on Ukraine's nuclear infrastructure and its occupation of the Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant remind us that nuclear danger has once again become a matter of global urgency.

The Kyiv Security Forum is dedicated to the Ukrainian heroes whose courage defends life and freedom.

We honor the Ukrainian soldiers on the frontlines. We honor the energy workers, rescuers, medics, and emergency responders who save lives under Russian attacks. We honor the heroes who forty years ago confronted the Chernobyl disaster and protected the world from an even greater catastrophe.

Marking the 40th anniversary of the Chornobyl disaster, this panel examines the legacy of the world's worst nuclear accident and its implications for today's security environment. The catastrophe demonstrated that a nuclear accident anywhere becomes a nuclear accident everywhere, prompting international efforts to strengthen nuclear safety and preparedness.

Today, Russia's invasion of Ukraine once again places nuclear security at the center of global concern. The militarization of nuclear facilities, Russia's nuclear threats, and the violation of the Budapest Memorandum raise profound questions about the credibility of nuclear guarantees and the stability of the global nuclear security architecture.

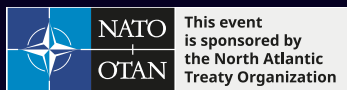
